Dear Residents and Businesses close to The Cenotaph

As Lord Mayor of Bristol, I write to advise we are planning to hold Bristol's Annual Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service at The Cenotaph on Sunday 13 November. As in previous years, I very much hope that as a local residents and businesses, you will support us as we mark this important, national commemoration.

You may well have attended the parade and service at the Cenotaph before and if so, you will be familiar with the format. If not, the act of remembrance will take approx. 1 hour.

To support the event, significant road closures and diversions will be in place around the city centre from 05:00 - 13:00, with a vehicle tow-away also in operation. Pedestrian and emergency access will be maintained to all properties throughout the event. Please see overleaf for a list of roads affected.

A large military parade and civic procession will form at College Green, leaving for the Cenotaph at around 10:30. The service itself will begin with a 2-minute silence (marked by gun fire at St Augustine's Parade) and followed by the laying of wreathes.

Your support means a great deal to the City and I am more than happy to supply further details nearer the time if requested.

- Anchor Road** from its junction with Canons Road to its junction with Canons Way
- Baldwin Street** from its junction with Colston Street to its junction with Marsh Street
- Broad Quay** from its junction with Colston Avenue to its junction with Prince Street
- Canons Road** from its junction with College Green / St Augustine's Parade to its junction with Anchor Road
- Christmas Street** from its junction with Rupert Street to its junction with Nelson Street
- Colston Avenue** from its junctions with Lewins Mead / Rupert Street / Quay Street to its junctions with St Augustine's Parade / Broad Quay
- Colston Street** from its junction with Pipe Lane to its junction with Colston Avenue
- College Green** from its junction with Park Street to its junction with St Augustine's Parade
- Denmark Street** from its junction with Gaunts Lane to its junction with St Augustine's Parade
- Lewins Mead** from its junction with Colston Avenue to its junction with Rupert Street
- Marsh Street** from its junction with Baldwin Street to its junction with Broad Quay
- Nelson Street** from its junction with Christmas Street to its junction with Bridewell Street
- Park Street** from its junction with College Green to its junction with St Georges Road
- Prince Street** from its junction with Broad Quay to its junction with Middleton Avenue
- Quay Street** from its junction with Colston Avenue to its junction with Nelson Street
- Queen Charlotte Street** from its junction with Baldwin Street to its junction with Crow Lane
- Rupert Street** from its junction with Colston Avenue in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 155 metres
- St Augustine's Parade** from its junction with College Green to its junction with Colston Avenue
- Unity Street** from its junction with College Green to its junction with Denmark Street
- Small Street** from its junction with Corn Street to its junction with Quay Street
- St Stephens Avenue** from its junction with Clare Street to its junction with Colston Avenue in a south-easterly direction for 60 metres
- Quay Street** from its junction with Small Street to its junction with Christmas Street
