Business Flood Planning and Recovery

To support businesses with flood-related guidance and assistance, we are sharing the following information provided by the Wessex Flood Resilience Team.

Having a business continuity or emergency plan can significantly mitigate the effects of flooding. Additionally, making adaptations to your property can help prevent water from entering your premises or reduce the impact when flooding occurs. We encourage you to explore these helpful resources to help with both flood preparation and recovery.

Business Support and Advice

- Mary Long-Dhonau has produced practical guides that help businesses take proactive steps to prepare for a flood, including a <u>Business Flood Handbook</u> and a <u>Business Guide to Flood Resilience</u>. If flooding occurs outside of business hours, staff might not be on site. Flood Warnings are a crucial tool for knowing when action needs to be taken, including when there are impacts on transport routes that staff or deliveries might need to use. You don't have to live in the warning area to sign up for this free service – start by searching for your nearest town or city.

Reporting Flooding

Reporting flooding helps agencies to respond and prioritise recovery efforts, and helps capture the true costs of a flood, building a case for future interventions.
